To follow up on our conversation, we met with the County to discuss our options. We were informed the hearing on 9/16 is for the planning commission's recommendation only. The comp plan will not be voted on by the council until November 29th I believe (we were also informed that we have the ability to withdraw our request at any point prior to the council's decision).
